Northern Region


1. This is considered one of the most adventurous swinging bridges in Iowa! Take a deep breath and face your fears! This swinging bridge has a grated floor allowing you beautiful views of the West Fork Cedar River below as you swing your way over!

2. Must stop location for a cool sweet treat in Decorah!

3. Wander through an open air museum which depicts the story of immigration from the point of view of Norwegian immigrants!

4. Mascara Park sounds like it was named after a beauty tool for our eyes. However, this park is actually named after a town's sister city in Mascara, Algeria. Find the peace poles that are identical to ones in Algeria!

5. Housed in one of the original Carnegie libraries, this place allows visitors to see the world in miniatures. Check out Under the Big Top Diorama and learn about real circus companies like Gollmar Brothers who regularly toured Iowa countries to entertain!
