How to Pick A Session

Theme

Sessions have different themes that you can pick through to find something that you enjoy! Some themes are water based, art, science, climbing, horses, nature and more! Your session will focus more on that topic and get to do special activities that are only for your session.

If you can't pick there are sessions at every age that does a bit of everything! Check out Ready, Set, Camp, Happy Camper and Eclectic Adventure.



Length

There are a few different lengths of session offered and it's important to choose how long you are comfortable staying at camp and what fits in your schedule.

- Mini Sessions: These sessions are 2 nights/ 3 days are a great intro to camp or to fit in a busy schedule.
- Classic Sessions: 5 nights/6 days. These are a traditional week with lots of time for activities
- Extended Sessions: For experienced campers in the horse program and Leadership camps, these sessions last 9 or 10 nights depending on the session.

Badgework & Progression

Some sessions build on what you've done previously at camp. You must have done the previous session(s) in order to attend that session like in the Progressive Horse Program. This way you can do new things and build your skills each year! Get started in the program with eQuestrians!

All campers will earn a badge while at camp for their age level and a patch from a GSUSA patch program that they take home with them.



Housing

There are a few different options of where to stay at camp and you get to know where you will be staying when you look at sessions in the camp guide. Learn a bit more about where you can stay at Camp Liberty!

Rustic Cabins:

The Ridge, Outpost, North Star
& Prairie's Edge

Enjoy a classic camp experience in these units. They feature cabins that house up to four campers on cots. There is electricity in the unit, but not in the individual cabins.

Modern Cabins:

Woodlands & Horseshoe Bend

These recently updated units feature cabins or mini barns with bunkbeds holding up to 6 campers with counselors staying a nearby individual cabin. Cabins feature electricity and overhead fans.

Lodge Cabins:

Clover, Violet & Sunflower

These units are connected to the lodge and feature bunkbeds that can hold up to 20 campers from two different groups in a dorm style. Counselors stay in an attached room. These units are airconditioned and have attached restrooms and showers.




Travel

Neckers & Pins

Everyone at Camp Liberty have a special neck scarf called a necker. If this is your first summer at camp, you will receive yours at the opening night ceremony. Campers have blue ones, Counselors-in-Training have tan and staff have green, but they all have a Girl Scout green stripe showing how we are connected and are tied with a friendship knot. These are a great place to collect your year pins you get at final night!



Final Night

On the last night of camp, we celebrate all the fun we've had and memories we've made together with a campfire. We sing some of our favorite camp songs, reflect on the best parts of the week, receive your unique pin for this summer from your counselor and honor people have been attending GSEIWI camps for 5, 10, 15 years or even more! At the end we finish with a friendship circle as we sing.

Counselors-in-training

Camp Names

The founder of Girl Scouts, Juliette Gordon Low, went by a nickname, Daisy. In honor of her, camp staff still uses nicknames known as camp names. That's why you will run into counselors named things like Dolphin or Berry! It adds a bit of fun to the summer and is a great Girl Scout tradition. When campers are Counselors-in-Training or Equestrian Specialist Interns, they get the chance to pick their own camp names!

Big Foot

There are a lot of trails exploring the beautiful landscapes of Camp Liberty. As your group is traveling around, you'll want to keep an eye out for our friend Big Foot! Each week Big Foot is out and about around camp and when a group finds him, they can take their picture with him and it is added to our Big Foot Sightings board. He can be tricky, so you may need to check out some new trails to track him down.



Scout's Own

Before heading home after your week at camp, we gather in the lodge for one last camp tradition! A Scout's Own is a presentation, whether a skit, demonstration, or song, that Girl Scouts' create to share something they learned during their time at camp or their favorite part of the week. Once all the groups get to share with the whole camp and their families, we end with the camp song and get ready for checkout and telling our families about all the cool things we've done!

The Fab 5

At camp we have what we call The Fab 5. These are items that you should have with you at all times as you travel around camp.

The Fab 5 Relay

Find two sturdy backpacks like what you would use at camp. Place them on the ground. This will be your starting line. A ways down from each backpack your will place a basket or box that contains your five items plus a bunch of other stuff that aren't on the list.

Split into two teams and each one will line up behind a backpack and relay style will take turns running down to find one of their Fab 5 and bring it back to their team's backpack.

The first team to collect all of their items correctly and zip up their backpack wins!

GAMES!

Sometimes there is a bit of extra time while waiting for flag ceremonies to start or food to cook at your campfire.

Thankfully, our camp counselors know many wonderful games to make passing the time fun.

Learn a few of our Camp Liberty favorites below!

FROGGER

You need at least 6 people to play this game. One will be a detective. The detective goes to the center of the circle and everyone closes their eyes. One person is tapped on the head and is selected to be the frogger. Everyone opens their eyes and the job of the frogger is to stick out their tongue without the detective seeing them do it. When the rest of the group sees the tongue, they respond by falling back, dramatically. The detective gets three guesses as to whom it is.

WAX MUSEUM

One person is the museum guard, and everyone else is the statues. The museum guard closes their eyes, faces away from the crowd, and counts down from 10.. Then, the statues come to life! As soon as the guard turns around, the statues freeze. See how many different poses you can make without the guard seeing you move. If the guard spots any movement, the statue is out.

It's fun to play this game at night with flashlights, too!

SONGS

Girl Scouts have been singing from the beginning! Whether it is fast songs following meals, repeat songs as a group while you hike, or quieter songs around the campfire with your counselors, camp is full of music. You may have even sung some of the same songs with your troop like Make New Friends. Whether we're learning the song for the first time or have sung it a million times before, it's always magical when Girl Scouts sing together.

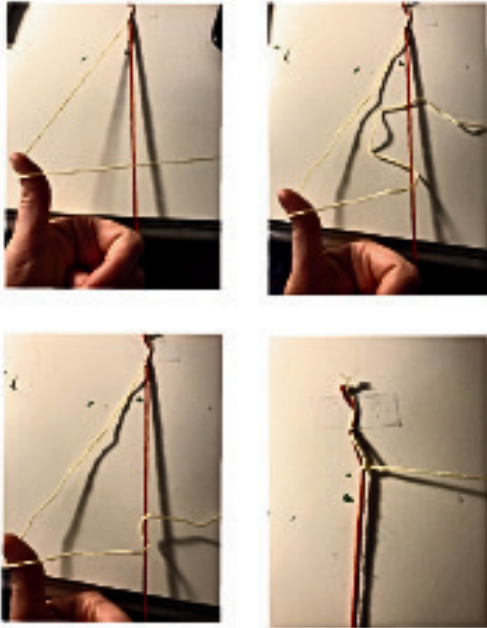

Friendship Bracelets

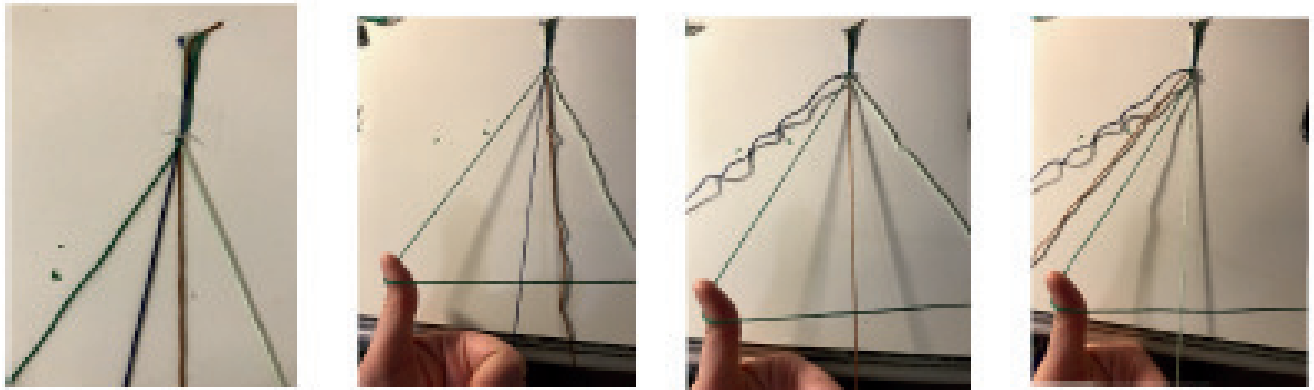
Camp is an amazing place to make friends, silver and gold! Campers love to make and exchange bracelets with the new friends they meet at camp!



THREE STRAND BRACELET

1. Make a four with one string. Hold the other two strings straight down together.
2. Take the tail of the four, wrap behind the other two strings and pass through the opening of the four.
3. While holding onto the end of the first color pull the string tightly up towards the top of your bracelet. That's your first knot.
4. Repeat steps 1-3 with the first color at least 10 times.
5. To switch colors take the first color string and put it with the other strings, then choose your next color and start over at number one.

DIAGONAL BRACELET



1. Start with at least 4 strands of floss.
2. Use the "4" knot, start with the far left string and make knots around the next string to the right. 2 knots per string.
3. Make two "4" knots around each of the strings moving to the right until you are out of strings to make knots around.
4. Once you have made knots around each of those strings, leave the first string at the end and pick up the new farthest left string and repeat the process.

Learn a camp skill

An amazing part of camp is getting to learn new things! This includes camp skills that you'll get to use and build on for the entire time you're a Girl Scout! Get started with one of those skills by trying out the two knots below. If you want to see a video of how to do it, click the name of the knot.

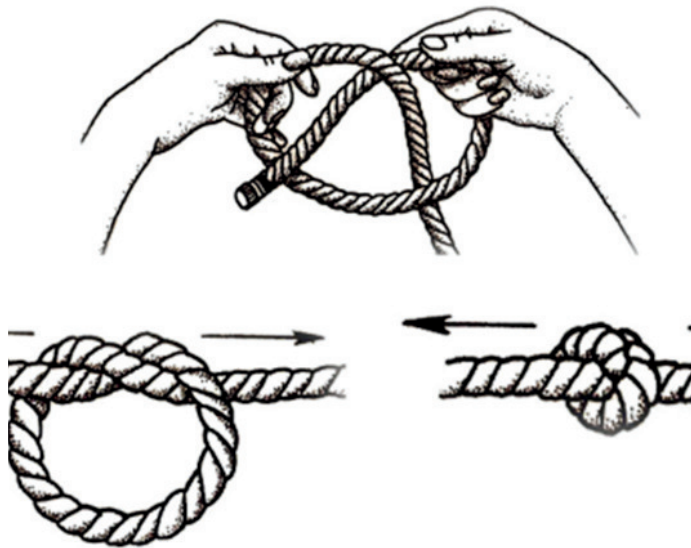
OVERHAND KNOT

Instructions

1. Form a loop with one end of your rope
2. Pass the one end through the loop
3. Pull tight

Used For

- Putting a knot in the end of a rope to keep it from fraying
- Making a "stop" to keep your hand from sliding off the end of the rope
- Joining two pieces of string or cord that you do not wish to undo later



SQUARE KNOT

Instructions

1. Place one end in the right hand over in the left hand and tie an Overhand Knot.
2. Place the end in the left hand over the end in the right hand and tie a second Overhand Knot.
3. Pull ends tight. "Right over left, left over right, ties a square knot, tidy and tight."

Used For

- Tying two rope ends of the same size together
- Many craft projects, for instance tying bandanas, macramé, etc.



Helpful Hint

If tied using right over right or left over left, a very unreliable "Granny Knot" will result. This knot is difficult to untie after put under strain

SCAVENGER HUNT

One of the best parts of camp is getting to be out in nature! Take your first steps out on the trail by going on a nature scavenger hunt in your neighborhood or at a local park. Remember to leave everything where you find it, take only photos.
