Happy Back-to-Troop!

Back-to-school means back-to-troop! This time of year it is important to do troop updates and reset for the troop year ahead. Here are a few things to do to make sure you are ready for a fun-filled year!

ACH/Banking Forms

This is the best time of year to make sure all Girl Scout bank accounts have two registered, background checked signers! All troops must have ACH/Banking paperwork completed before participating in the Fall Product Program. Volunteers should reach out to info@girlscoutstoday.org for assistance.

Whether your troop meeting schedule or location is new, or you would like to open your troop to new members, please take a few minutes to fill out the <u>Troop Information Update Form</u>.

Submit your troop finance report before September 30

The Finance tab in the Volunteer Toolkit is the place to record troop income and expenses from the troop year and submit your troop finance report. Get your troop's finance report submitted early to be included in a prize drawing. Yours could be selected from the finance reports received by August 15, September 5, and September 26.

All troops must submit their finance report before September 30, 2025.

Permission Forms

Remember to get new permission forms for your troop members, now that the new troop year is starting! Troop Leaders should keep these forms all year, to ensure they have necessary information in the event of an emergency, as well as permission to participate in both the Fall Product Program and Cookie Program. It's a simple, fun product program offering girls and troops the opportunity to earn funds for Girl Scout activities while also practicing five important skills: goal setting, decision making, money management, people skills and business ethics. President's Volunteer Service Award

<u>The President's Volunteer Service Award</u> is on a temporary pause, as decided by AmeriCorps (the organization that oversees the program). We are unable to certify any volunteer service for the PVSA at this time. We do not know when this program might resume or any other information but will share an update in the Service Unit Update if more information becomes available.

Girl Scout Travel

From day trips to international travel, Girl Scouts has opportunities for youth to learn the life-skills necessary for successful travel as an adult. Youth will learn adaptability in navigating unfamiliar environments, independence, problem solving, and listening skills to name a few. <u>Learn about the Girl Scout travel progression</u> so you can support youth development through travel experiences.

Here are some tips and things you need to know about traveling with your troop:

- 1. Start small: day trips and shorter distance trips if you have not yet traveled with your troop.
- 2. Take the travel training available on gsLearn before planning any field trips or overnights.
- 3. If troops are traveling more than 100 miles from their typical meeting place, they must fill out the <u>Troop Trip Approval</u> form on our website.
- 4. Transporting youth has some additional rules. All adults driving Girl Scouts must be registered, background checked, over 21 and a licensed driver (teen drivers can NEVER drive other Girl Scouts to activities), drive a registered and insured vehicle, and have a good driving record.
- 5. When driving more than 150 miles, each driver must submit an MVR (Motor Vehicle Record)
- Create a binder to hold your troop's yearlong permission slips, accident forms, and council emergency card. Plan to keep this and a first aid kit with one troop leader during field trips or longer travel experiences.
- 7. Refer to <u>Safety Activity Checkpoints</u> for more in-depth transportation and activity guidelines.

Feel nervous about planning your troop's first travel experiences? Register for a council event! Our team plans and facilitates activities with partners while you focus on transportation details and guiding your troop during the experience.
